


He called his Sports Day the Wenlock Olympian Games.

The Games started with a procession through the town led by a boy riding on a white horse.

### Wenlock Olympian Games



The races at the Wenlock Olympian Games were given different names from the races we have at our Sports Days today.

The foot race we now call a sprint.

The running high leap we now call the high jump.

The running long leap we now call the long jump.

There was also a three legged race, sack race and throwing a stone!

These races were for men and boys only.

An old ladies race for a pound of tea.


### Cycle races /

## Prizes



The winners of the Wenlock Olympian Games won money, books or medals as a prize. This is the medal given to the winner of five running and jumping races, called a pentathlon.

It was made by Queen Victoria's jeweller in silver and then later in gold.





This is the medal you could win if you took part in the Wenlock Olympian Games today.



### Other competitions

Do you like drawing, painting or making music?









This was the medal won by a child for a crayon drawing at the Olympian Games.

In his Olympian Games Dr. Brookes had competitions for drawing, painting, sewing, making music, spelling, maths, handwriting and the best poem.

These competitions were for boys, girls and adults.

#### Why was Dr Brookes so special?

Dr. William Penny Brookes was special because he helped to start Olympian Games in other places.

A modern Olympic Games was held in Athens, Greece in 1859. Dr. Brookes sent £10 as a prize, this was a lot of money then. The winner of the race won the Wenlock Prize.





Dr. Brookes helped start an Olympian Games at the Crystal Palace, London in 1866.





The King and Queen of Greece sent a silver cup as a prize for Dr. Brookes' Olympian Games in 1877.

#### Start of the Olympic Games





Dr. Brookes invited a man from Paris, France called Baron Pierre de Coubertin to see the Wenlock Olympian Games in 1890.





He enjoyed the Games so much that he sent a special medal to be given at the next Games.



The man from France liked Dr. Brookes' idea of a Games and used it to start the Olympic Games we have today. The first Modern Olympic Games were held in Athens, Greece in 1896.

### The Olympian Games

William Penny Brookes died in 1895. The Wenlock Olympian Games that he started a long time ago carried on and are still held today.











